General Assembly

In 2016 the Young Friends hosted their General Assembly (GA) in Vienna, Austria. The GAs take place annually as a dedicated meeting for the YFCS to discuss relevant topics and shared interests, gather information about EU policies and strategies. It is an opportunity for the members to interact, shape their views, ideas and experiences.

The GA Conference opened with the speech of Felix Graf MONTECUCCOLI, who delivered a lecture about sustainable land-use. First he outlined that Austria finds itself at the top of sustainability in Europe. On top of that he explained his concept of sustainable land-use, defining it in terms of managing the land in order to produce the demanded food whilst keeping a balance with biodiversity. He emphasized that risk management is





a crucial topic in Austria especially regarding the given natural hazards and risks in the mountain area and it might explain why there is such a high awareness for sustainable land-use. Finally, MON-TECUCCOLI concluded that Europe needs to redesign its sustainability – a healthy balance between supporting the economic needs of the producers and at the same time with a strong focus on biodiversity would be worth striving for.

Venzel CZERNIN introduced us into the business of managing a golf club by demonstrating how his approach is running the golf club. Ferdinand TRAUTMANNSDORF presented the variety of fishes he breeds in different ponds on his estates. Also, he explained his unique business concept, which includes retailer in the whole city of Vienna. Both are parade examples for innovative and successful ways to diversify an estate.

Ana ROCHA, liaison between ELO and the British landowner organization, gave the Young Friends an exclusive first-hand update about Brexit. She passionately pointed out both sides of the "Stay IN" and "Stay Out" debates and explained how

and why the Brexit could have happened. She stated that "nothing has changed yet" and remains curious in how the Brexit will change European and British law.

Afterwards, YFCS ambassador Alix HEIM de BALSAC introduced us to the youth organization "Forum Forêt", which she founded and which is designed to answer more forestry-specific questions to young people in France.

The following day, the Young Friends were visiting the mushroom farm of the EDLINGER family. The Young Friends could gather an insight into how mushrooms are produced! We were shown to the different stages of growth of the mushrooms and were impressed by the complexity of breeding mushrooms.

In 2017 the Young Friends will hold, for the first time, their General Assembly together with the General Assembly of the Friends of the Countryside (FCS) in Maastricht, Belgium, on June 2nd.



Forum for Countryside Entrepreneurship


