Events 2018

The Young Friends of the Countryside's **Forum for the Countryside Entrepreneurship (FCE)** took place in Scotland on the weekend of the 16th to the 18th of March 2018. On Friday, the Young Friends met up in Edinburgh before heading to St Andrews on Saturday morning for the conference for the FCE. The Young Friends were very fortunate to listen to some inspiring speakers during the conference at St Andrews.

First of all, Lord JOICEY (FCS board member) introduced his concept of rural entrepreneurship to the Young Friends, explaining his idea of bringing life back to the countryside by supporting local entrepreneurs. The Young Friends were fascinated by his idea and a lively discussion took place after his presentation. Then Ana ROCHA, Senior Policy Officer for Agriculture and Forestry at the European Landowners' Organisation, explained current misconceptions about the Common Agricultural Policy and updated YFCS' members on the current negotiation statuses. Following Ana ROCHA's very engaging presentation, Geoffroy DE CANNIÈRE, YFCS board member, urged the audience to look out for rural start-ups and entrepreneurial projects concerning the countryside. He introduced



the winners of the two last years, CIDRE WIGNAC and TINY HOUSE, to the audience and showed the impact the Famigro Award, a yearly prize given by the Young Friends for the best rural entrepreneurial project, can have for the winners of the projects. Applications for this year's FAMIGRO AWARD are now closed. We look forward to announcing the winner soon.



In the afternoon, the Young Friends were welcomed by Edward BAXTER, who showed Gilmore Estate to the Young Friends. He brought two key ideas to the Young Friends. First, he showed the Young Friends how he integrates sustainable projects supporting the environment on his estate. Secondly, he pointed out how important the power of 'we', compared to 'l', is. Having joined forces with two other estates, he outlined how the power balance can favourably shift towards a powerful 'we', helping to provoke a change and having an impact on the Scottish countryside. Last, but not least, he also showed how social media can be a helpful tool for landowners. After his presentation, Edward BAXTER showed some of his projects to the Young Friends.

In the evening, the Young Friends then hosted a gala dinner at Edinburgh Castle. Shortly before the gala dinner the Young Friends were given a short historical excursion on Scottish history by discovering the crown jewels of Scotland, known as the Honours of Scotland, and the Stone of Scone. Finally, on Sunday, the Young Friends went on a guided tour of Edinburgh Castle before the FCE was officially ended.

The Young Friends would like to particularly thank its generous host, Edward BAXTER and speakers, Lord JOICEY and Ana ROCHA, for sharing their ideas with us and to have taken the time for the Young Friends. We were very grateful and hope to implement the new ideas gained in one way or another.

In March the Young Friends took part in the **Forum for the Future of Agriculture (FFA)** in Brussels and had the chance to learn from world-renowned experts who work at the forefront of the most pressing issues around agriculture. The FFA is a tremendous opportunity to learn more from leading thinkers and it is an incredible opportunity for the Young Friends to be able to join the FFA.



Recruitment and strengthening the links with the FCS remains an important topic for our organization, therefore I would like to encourage all YFCS members who are approaching the age of 35 (or who have passed it), to consider **moving on to the FCS** in order to continue together the journey we started already many years ago. Famigro 2018

In order to raise awareness of the importance of a sustainable, economic and dynamic countryside, Karl GROTENFELT created the FAMIGRO AWARD back in 2013. The award recognises a start-up in the rural sector that brings innovative and fresh ideas and supports the project financially allowing it to grow as well as giving exposure through the YFCS network. This is at the heart of the philosophy of the Young Friends : that entrepreneurial projects are one of the cornerstones of the evolution of the rural countryside.

In the words of Karl GROTENFELT:

From my own experience I know the demands that young farmers and landowners encounter when looking at alternative ways to develop their enterprise. Traditional farming does not necessarily provide the income to develop and enhance the farm. Without these innovative young entrepreneurs we risk seeing our countryside become depopulated.

The idea behind the FAMIGRO AWARD is to award a young countryside entrepreneur that has started an innovative business providing income and employment in the countryside.

The winner of FAMIGRO 2018 was the startup "Cou-



coo" which was created by two friends and young entrepreneurs Gaspard de Moustier and Emmanuel de La Bédoyère. They convinced the owners of 4 estates to build huts, cabins and treehouses together in order to attract eco-tourism.

In the words of Coucoo:

In 2009, Gaspard de Moustier chose to promote a family-owned land in Franche-Comté by offering a new kind of holiday - an authentic experience in cabins perched in the top of trees.



In 2011, Gaspard crossed paths with Emmanuel de La Bédoyère who had just left the realm of investment banking for his family farm. Driven by their shared passion for nature, and their appetite for challenges, the two men founded a second eco-resort in Picardy in 2015.

Already at the head of four eco-resorts that are the figureheads of alternative, unusual and responsible tourism in France, the inseparable duo looks forward to extending the Coucoo philosophy to other areas relying on their three core values:

- The amazement and satisfaction of the customer;
- The promotion of local lands and artisans;
- Technological and ecological innovation.

Coucoo discovered the Famigro Entrepreneurship Award thanks to Geoffroy de Canniere, a business developer in the forestry sector. We were very happy to have received the award in 2018. It opened up to us a great network of entrepreneurs. We very much hope that it will help us find new locations to develop our Coucoo eco-resorts.
